Headline: PA Officials Warn Obama Over Visiting Al-Aqsa

Political and religious leaders in the Palestinian Authority on Sunday stressed that U.S. President Barack Obama should not visit the Al-Aqsa mosque compound in Jerusalem in a way that might compromise what they called its "Muslim sovereignty," AFP reports. Obama will be arriving in the region in the spring, and PA media has been speculating that he will visit the site of the mosque. The White House, however, has announced neither the dates of Obama's visit nor its itinerary. Sheikh Akrameh Sabri, head of the higher Islamic council and former Grand Mufti of Jerusalem, said that Obama must enter through a gate that was not under Israeli auspices. "Any visitor is welcome to Al-Aqsa, but they should follow the regulations of the Waqf and enter through the Lions' Gate and not through Mughrabi Gate, to ensure Muslim sovereignty," he said at a press conference and was quoted by AFP. Hatem Abdel Qader, who heads the Jerusalem portfolio of the Fatah movement, said that Obama's visit should be coordinated with the PA and with the Jordanians. "The visit shouldn't have a political theme to it because Al-Aqsa belongs to Muslims only and it is their place of worship and we refuse that any Israeli official accompanies the visitor," said Sabri.

Headline: Netanyahu calls on PA to control violence after third day of protests across West Bank

Israel said on Sunday it sent "an unequivocal demand" to Palestinian leaders to quell unrest, as thousands of detainees staged hunger strikes in Israeli prisons and their supporters clashed with security forces in the occupied West Bank. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu at the same time ordered the transfer of January arrears of tax revenues that Israel collects on the behalf of the Palestinians but has been withholding, the government said in a statement. "Israel passed an unequivocal demand to the Palestinian Authority to calm down the territory," the statement said. "In order that the non-payment of taxes that Israel collects for the Palestinians should not serve as an excuse for the Palestinian Authority not to calm the territory, Netanyahu instructed the money for January to be transferred," it added. Protests in the West Bank have been mounting, both in support of Palestinian prisoners held by Israel -- 11 of whom are on open-ended hunger strike -- and against settlement expansion.

Headline: Thousands attend funeral of Palestinian detainee who died in Israeli prison

In a statement on Palestinian detainee Arafat Jaradat's death, Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas blasted Israel on Monday afternoon. "We won't allow them to play with the lives of our sons," he said at a memorial ceremony held for those killed in a 1983 bombing of a Palestinian research center in Beirut. "We won't allow our prisoners to remain behind bars for life due to unfounded charges." Abbas demanded an inquiry into Jaradat's death and added that it would Israel responsible for the incident. He further accused Israel of trying to generate a situation in which the Palestinians no longer want peace, but stressed: "We demand peace that is based on justice and the uprooting of settlements." Palestinians report that 10 people were wounded by IDF fire on Monday afternoon in the West Bank town of Beitounia, next to the Ofer military compound. The IDF confirmed 6 Palestinians have been wounded, but claimed the casualties are from rubber bullets and denied it used live ammunition. Clashes ensued between some 100 Palestinians and IDF forces there as they protested the death of detainee Arafat Jaradat, who died in Israeli prison on Saturday.

Headline: Israel fears prisoner death may spark Palestinian uprising

Masked Palestinian gunmen fired in the air on Monday as thousands marched at the West Bank funeral of a prisoner whose death in an Israeli jail has raised fears in Israel of a new uprising. Arafat Jaradat's death on Saturday and a hunger strike by four other Palestinian inmates have raised tension in the occupied territory after repeated clashes between stone-throwers and Israeli soldiers in recent days. Israeli troops, on high alert, took up positions outside Jaradat's home village of Se'eer, in earshot of bursts of automatic fire from the half-dozen masked Palestinians in full battle dress. "We sacrifice our souls and blood for you, our martyr!" mourners chanted. In confrontations with stone-throwers elsewhere in the West Bank, Israeli soldiers wounded at least six Palestinians. Doctors said some of the injuries were gunshot wounds, though the army said it used non-lethal weapons only. The scenes were reminiscent of the Intifada, Arabic for uprising, that started in 2000 after Israeli-Palestinian peace talks failed. A previous Intifada, in 1987-1993, led to interim accords and limited Palestinian self-rule.

Headline: Israel, US successfully test anti-missile system in joint exercise

Israel's Defense Ministry says a joint exercise with U.S. forces has successfully tested the Arrow anti-missile system for the first time. The system is meant to defend Israel from the threat of an Iranian strike. The ministry said Monday the test was "a major milestone in the development of the Arrow 3 Weapon System." The Arrow is produced jointly by Israel Aerospace Industries Ltd. and Chicago-based Boeing Co. It detects an incoming missile and destroys it with a second missile. Iran's Shahab ballistic missile can carry a nuclear warhead and has a range of 1,250 miles, putting Israel well within range. The Arrow is part of Israel's multilayered shield designed to intercept rockets and missiles. Israel sees Iran's nuclear and ballistic missile program as an existential threat.

Headline: Syrian Jihadi Salafists 'setting sights' on Jordan

Syrian Jihadi Salafist groups have begun pushing to carry out military acts in neighbouring states such as Jordan, Islamist sources say, creating new divisions among Islamist militants fighting in the country. According to an Islamist source, foreign Jihadi Salafists in Syria have begun to push to "expand" their so-called holy war into Jordan, Lebanon and Turkey amidst their ongoing campaign against Damascus. The new drive comes in direct contradiction with the declared stance of the Jabhat Al Nusra Li-ahl Al Sham — the largest Jihadi Salafist coalition in Syria, which has reportedly played a pivotal role in rebel gains across the country in recent weeks — which has restricted its fighters to military acts against Syrian regime forces. "There is concern among Jabhat Al Nusra leaders that many of these foreign fighters are bringing with them a foreign agenda," said Mohammed

Abu Suleiman, a Jihadi coordinator with ties to Jabhat Al Nusra. "The last thing we want is to have outside groups hijack our battle to defend the Muslim nation from the Godless regime of Assad." According to Jihadi Salafist sources, the split over expanding military activities has created new friction between Syrian Islamists and the some 400 veteran Jihadi Salafists who have trickled into the country from Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Jordan and Yemen.

Headline: Lebanon strike shuts schools

Lebanon's public sector strike on Monday spread to the country's schools, with private and public institutions across the country shutting down as teachers walked out in demand for increased public sector wages. The Syndicate Coordination Committee leading the strike also is set to hold protests across the country after it announced Saturday that it would be escalating measures ahead of Wednesday's expected cabinet session. Private Teachers Syndicate head Nehme Mahfoud on Sunday called on all school teachers to hold "peaceful and democratic" demonstrations against the government delay in wrapping up a new system of wage increases for public employees.

Headline: Tension high after Syria army kills four in Lebanon

Lebanon's president and prime minister urged Syria Sunday to stop shelling Lebanese territory after four Lebanese were killed by gunfire from the Syrian side of the border, in incidents that heightened tensions on the two neighbors' frontier. The renewal of deadly incidents on the Lebanese-Syrian border, which had claimed the lives of several Lebanese citizens last year, evoked fresh calls by the opposition March 14 parties for the deployment of the Lebanese Army and U.N. troops along the two countries' common boundaries. President Michel Sleiman voiced regret over the death of Lebanese citizens by Syrian shelling in the northern Wadi Khaled region and the village of Heesha near the border with Syria, while Prime Minister Najib Mikati asked Foreign Minister Adnan Mansour to protest to Syrian authorities over these incidents. "[Sleiman] stressed the need to remain committed to the neutral stance [of Lebanon] which calls for not interfering in the affairs of other countries, particularly Syria," according to a statement released by the president's office.

Headline: Civil disobedience grips Cairo as protests rock the rest of Egypt

Headline: Morsi Seeks Talks With Opposition Amid Boycott Calls

Protesters on Sunday blocked the doors to Cairo's main administrative building as part of a growing campaign of civil disobedience around the country against President Mohamed Mursi. A group of

protesters closed the doors of the Mugamma, a massive labyrinth of bureaucratic offices on the edge of Tahrir Square, leaving only a side exit for employees to leave, employees told AFP. "This is a call for civil disobedience... We want the implementation of the goals of the revolution such as social justice as well as a delay of parliamentary elections" which is set for April 22, one of the protesters told AFP, declining to give his name. "We must break the monopoly of the state by Brotherhood," he added, referring to Mursi's Muslim Brotherhood who is currently in office. Since a November decree that pushed through an Islamist-drafted constitution, Egypt has been deeply divided between Mursi's Islamist supporters and a wide-ranging opposition that accuses the president of betraying the uprising that brought him to office and consolidating power in the hands of his Muslim Brotherhood.

Headline: Syrian foreign minister holds talks in Moscow

Headline: Syrian rebel officer says no talks before Assad goes

Syrian Foreign Minister Walid al-Muallem is due to discuss ways to start a dialogue with the country's opposition Monday during talks in Moscow with his Russian counterpart Sergey Lavrov. A Russian foreign ministry official told RIA Novosti that "Russia is exerting more efforts to find a rapid solution to the Syrian crisis." Russia, a traditional ally of Syrian President Bashar Assad, has recently reiterated its stand that only a political solution will solve the crisis in the war-torn Middle Eastern nation.

According to UN estimates, 70,000 people have died since the conflict began, in March 2011.

Diplomats in Beirut said the United States was urging the opposition to return to dialogue and meet new U.S. Secretary of State John Kerry in Rome on Thursday, after its representatives pulled out of the talks in protest at the international community's silence on the continuing bloodshed in Syria.

Headline: Syria Jihadists Claim Bus Bombing on Hama Factory

The jihadist Al-Nusra Front on Sunday claimed responsibility for a suicide attack earlier this month on an army factory in the central Syrian province of Hama that reportedly killed at least 60 people. "Thank God, your brothers in Al-Nusra Front... carried out a martyrdom (suicide) operation that targeted an army factory in the town of Tal Baraq in Hama province," on February 6, the jihadist group said in a statement posted on the Internet, as quoted by *AFP*. According to its account, one of its fighters "drove a bus loaded with 2.5 tons of explosives" towards a group of "shabiha," or pro-regime militiamen, as they gathered outside the factory to receive their pay, and blew himself up. Al-Nusra said the attack was "in revenge for the Muslim children of the Sunni community who suffered from the crimes of the Alawites and their collaborators."

Headline: More than 50 killed in battle for Syria police academy

Headline: Syria rebels down chopper as regime raids towns, NGO says

At least 30 Syrian troops and 23 rebels were killed over the past 24 hours in fierce clashes for control of a police academy in the northern Aleppo province, a watchdog said on Monday. The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights also reported that rebels shot down a regime helicopter near a military base elsewhere in the north of the province as insurgents pressed on with attacks on the police academy in the west. At least 53 combatants -- 23 rebels including a battalion commander and 30 Syrian troops -- were killed over the past 24 hours in the fighting outside the town of Khan Assal, the Britain-based Observatory said. It said rebels took control of a building where troops were entrenched as warplanes tried to repel them and "took hostage dozens of pro-regime militants." But the pro-regime Al-Watan newspaper said Monday that "members of the police academy rebuffed the intensive attacks of armed men for the second consecutive day, inflicting heavy losses on them with artillery." The police academy is one of the last regime bastions in the west of Aleppo province.

The blast followed by heavy gunfire caused panic in the capital, where a massive car bombing on Thursday near the ruling Baath party headquarters killed at least 53 people. It was not immediately clear what the target of Monday's explosion was and whether there were casualties. State-run TV reported a "terrorist" explosion at the entrance to the northeastern neighborhood of Qaboun.

Headline: Iran fleet makes maiden voyage through Malacca Strait: Navy cmdr.

Iran's Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) has begun the third and last day of its ground and air military exercises codenamed Payambar-e A'zam 8 (The Great Prophet 8). The drill is being held in the eastern regions of the country, including the cities of Kerman, Siriz and Sirjan. Deputy Commander of the IRGC Ground Forces Brigadier General Abdullah Araqi said on Saturday that The Great Prophet 8 maneuver would involve the exercise of various techniques and tactics of passive defense in asymmetric warfare. As part of the ongoing maneuvers, the IRGC Ground Forces attacked mock enemy positions using intelligence provided by surveillance drones. Special modern warfare units conducted drills and various types of unmanned aerial vehicles were also tested.

Headline: Return of sectarian threats in Iraq raises alarm

The fliers began turning up at Sunni households in the Iraqi capital's Jihad neighborhood last week bearing a chilling message: Get out now or face "great agony" soon. The leaflets were signed by the Mukhtar Army, a new Shiite militant group with ties to Iran's Revolutionary Guard. "The zero hour has come. So leave along with your families. ... You are the enemy," the messages warned. Such overt threats all but disappeared as the darkest days of outright sectarian fighting waned in 2008 and Iraq stepped back from the brink of civil war. Their re-emergence now - nearly a decade after the U.S.-led invasion - is a worrying sign that rising sectarian tensions are again gnawing away at Iraqi society. Iraqis increasingly fear that militants on both sides of the country's sectarian divide are gearing up for a new round of violence that could undo the fragile gains Iraq has made in recent years. Members of the country's Sunni minority have been staging mass rallies for two months, with some calling for the toppling of a Shiite-led government they feel discriminates against them and is too closely allied with neighboring Iran. Sunni extremists have been stepping up large-scale attacks on predominantly Shiite targets, and concerns are growing that the brutal and increasingly sectarian fighting in Syria could spill across the border.

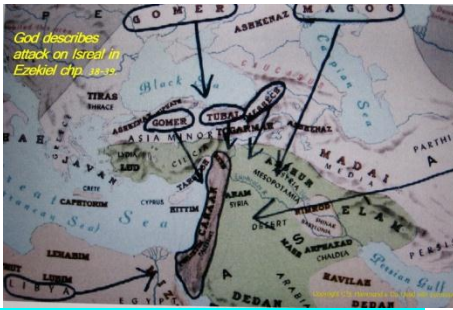
Headline: Erdoğan: Assad a 'mute devil' for not defying Israel

Turkey's prime minister denounced Syria's leader Sunday, calling him a "mute devil" for carrying out attacks on his own people but not standing up to Israel's occupation of Syrian territory. Recep Tayyip Erdoğan received several rounds of applause at a government communications forum in the United Arab Emirates, which has joined other Gulf nations in backing Syrian rebels seeking to topple President Bashar Assad. "We will not remain silent in the face of the cruel dictator, the mute devil, who mercilessly carried out massacres against his own people, but who has remained silent and unresponsive toward those who have occupied his own territories for decades," Erdoğan told the gathering in Sharjah, just north of Dubai.

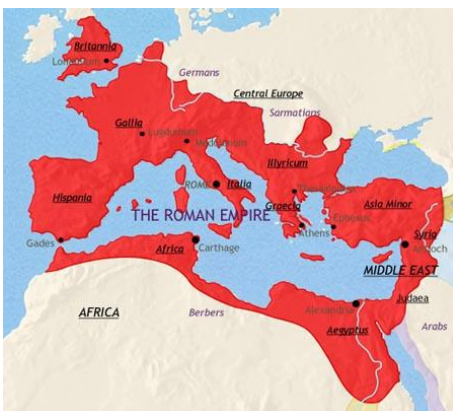

Headline: Afghan president orders US forces out of key province

Afghanistan's President Hamid Karzai has ordered that all U.S. special forces must leave Wardak province, just west of Kabul, within two weeks — citing allegations of disappearances and torture. In a statement Sunday, a spokesman for Karzai said, "after a thorough discussion, it became clear that armed individuals named as U.S. special force stationed in Wardak province engage in harassing, annoying, torturing and even murdering innocent people." Karzai's office cited a "recent example" in which nine people allegedly "disappeared" and a separate incident where a student was taken from his home in the middle of the night and whose tortured body was found two days later under a bridge with his throat cut. U.S. defense officials strongly deny that military personnel condoned, or were involved in, any kidnappings, torture or murders of Afghan civilians or suspects. Feb. 24, 2013

Headline: Germany ready to re-start EU-Turkey talks

German Chancellor Angela Merkel has backed France on re-starting EU accession talks with Turkey. Speaking in a regular, weekly podcast on Saturday (23 February), before going on a two-day visit to Turkey on Sunday, she said: "I think a long negotiating path lies ahead of us. Although I am sceptical, I agreed with the continuation of membership discussions. We are engaging in these in an open-ended manner ... In recent times, negotiations stalled somewhat and I am in favour of opening a new chapter in order to move forward." Turkey began EU entry talks in 2005. But the process stopped in 2010, after France and Cyprus - which is locked in a 40-year-old frozen conflict over the Turkish-occupied northern part of the island - vetoed 11 out of the 35 so-called negotiating chapters. The past few years have seen the European Commission accuse Turkey of trampling on human rights and Germany speak of a "privileged partnership" instead of EU accession. They have also seen Turkish politicians accuse the EU of Islamophobia and threaten to join Asian clubs, such as the Shanghai Co-operation Organisation, instead.

Headline: UK downgrade rounds off EU's Black Friday

Headline: UK argues downgrade shows need for austerity

Rating agency Moody's stripped the UK of its coveted AAA credit rating on Friday (22 February), rounding off a day of economic gloom in the EU. In a statement released shortly before the closure of the markets, Moody's said that the downgrade was the result of "continuing weakness in the UK's medium-term growth outlook, with a period of sluggish growth which Moody's now expects will extend into the second half of the decade". It is the first time Moody's has downgraded the UK's creditworthiness since its ratings system was set up in 1978. Meanwhile, the two other big rating agencies - Standard & Poor's and Fitch - are yet to cast their verdict ahead of the country's next annual budget on March 20. The downgrade leaves just six EU countries - Denmark, Finland, Germany, Luxembourg, the Netherlands and Sweden - with AAA ratings.

Headline: Euro Declines to Six-Week Low Amid Italian Election Concern

The euro fell to the lowest in six weeks versus the dollar after partial election results from Italy suggested the four-way race may end in a divided parliament requiring another vote.

The shared currency erased earlier gains as an IPR projection of partial results from the Italian ministry suggested Democratic Party candidate Pier Luigi Bersani, who had campaigned to maintain budget rigor, may have lost Senate races in Sicily, Campania and Lombardy to former Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi. The yen declined to the weakest since May 2010 against the dollar on speculation Prime Minister Shinzo Abe will select a supporter of aggressive monetary easing as the next Bank of Japan (8301) governor. "We think the euro will remain under pressure until we get more clarity," Sireen Harajli, a foreign-exchange strategist in New York at Credit Agricole SA (ACA), said in a telephone interview. "There's a lot of uncertainty there, and it's weighing on the euro and risk assets in general."

Headline: Chinese surveillance ships enter Japanese waters: Tokyo

Japan says three Chinese surveillance ships have entered its territorial waters off disputed islands in the East China Sea. According to a statement by Japan's Coast Guard, the ships entered the 12-nautical-mile territorial zone off Uotsuri, shortly before 1:00 pm local time (0400 GMT), on Sunday. The announcement came an hour after Japan claimed a Chinese fisheries patrol boat has briefly entered territorial waters off another disputed island. The disputed islands are known as Senkaku in Japan and Diaoyu in China. Earlier in February, Japan also accused China of sending surveillance ships to its territorial waters.

North Korea on Saturday threatened the United States with "miserable destruction" if the Pentagon goes ahead with its annual, routine military exercises with South Korea next month. "You had better bear in mind that those igniting a war are destined to meet a miserable destruction," said Pak Rim Su, chief of North Korea's military delegation to the Demilitarized Zone between the two countries. He called the drills were "reckless," accusing the United States and South Korea of preparing to invade the north. The regularly scheduled joint drills come amid heightened tensions, as North Korea

last week confirmed that it had conducted its most powerful nuclear test to date, in a striking act of defiance that drew condemnations from around the globe.

Headline: Four earthquakes rattle Japan

A strong 6.2-magnitude earthquake hit Japan on Monday, setting buildings in the capital swaying but causing no risk of a tsunami, the country's meteorological agency reported. National broadcaster NHK said there had been no abnormalities detected at nuclear power plants near the epicentre, which was north of Tokyo, where buildings rocked for upwards of half a minute, AFP reports.

"An earthquake occurred at about 16:23 today," the Japan Meteorological Agency said.

"Its focus was in the north of Tochigi prefecture. Its depth is about 10 kilometres and its magnitude is estimated at 6.2."

An earthquake measuring 5.4 on the Richter scale jolted Gerze county of Ali prefecture in southwest China's Tibet Autonomous Region at 1:11 pm Beijing Time on Monday, according to the China Earthquake Networks Centre. The epicentre, with a depth of nine km, was initially determined to be at 34.4 degrees north latitude and 85.7 degrees east longitude.

Another earthquake measuring 4.1 on the Richter scale occurred in the same area at 1:22 pm Beijing Time, with a depth of 3 km, the centre reported. No casualties have been reported so far.

Tropical Cyclone Rusty, drawing a bead on Australia, was upgraded to a Category 2 storm and meteorologists said Monday it likely will get much stronger. Headline: Bahrain national dialogue deadlocked by disagreements

Bahrain's national dialogue, aimed at ending the anti-regime protests in the Persian Gulf state, has reached a stalemate, due to major disagreements between the government and the opposition. "Major disagreements emerged Sunday" after the opposition asked that a representative of the king, and not only of the government, join the talks, according to a participant of the talks on Monday. The opposition argues that Bahrain's Al Khalifa monarchy "monopolizes all powers" in the tiny Persian Gulf state and a national dialogue would be worthless without a representative from the king. "The absence of authority, specifically a representative of the king, leaves the talks short of a key role player," the opposition said in a statement. The Al Khalifa monarchy "monopolizes all powers which we cannot discuss handing back to the people with parties that hold no authority," the statement added.

Headline: Yemen president in surprise southern trip as clashes rage

President Abed Rabbo Mansour Hadi toured on Sunday several southern Yemeni cities in a surprise visit, state media said, as police clashed with southern separatists amid calls for civil disobedience. State news agency Saba said Hadi arrived in Aden late Saturday on an "inspection visit", his first since becoming president in February 2012. A security official in the main southern city told AFP that Hadi was visiting to "closely check the situation in Aden following the unrest". On Sunday, he toured the nearby cities of Zinjibar and Jaar in the Abyan province, which were held by Al Qaeda linked militants for a year before the army drove them out in an assault in May 2012, the agency said. Protests have intensified in south Yemen since the killing of five people in clashes between police and pro-independence demonstrators on Thursday, when the deeply divided country marked a year since the ouster of strongman Ali Abdullah Saleh.

Thousands of protesters are out on the streets of Sofia, showing that discontent in Bulgaria has not been satisfied with the resignation of the prime minister and his government on February 20. People are still angry about extortionate energy bills and poverty – blaming what they call the 'energy mafia' and all politicians. "In the government there should be people who really care about Bulgaria, they should care about the country instead of thinking that the common people should manage by themselves," said one of the protesters. Another protester added: "We are now the poorest country in Europe. Why? Just because all these years we have been robbed and no money has been given to the Bulgarian people – and the little money that was given was taken from them."

Headline: 'Citizens' tide' of protests brings thousands to Spain's streets

Tens of thousands of Spaniards angry at ongoing hardship and corruption scandals demonstrated in cities across the country in what was described as a "citizens' tide" of protests. The date was chosen to coincide with the anniversary of a failed coup attempt in 1981. The protesters' manifesto said they targeted the "coup of the financial markets" they largely blame for the crisis. The government's austerity cuts were inevitably very much in their sights. "These measures can't go on. They try to convince us it's for everyone's good but it's the opposite. They're burying us more and more every day; we're never going to move forward like this," said protester Arancha Mendez in Madrid. The Madrid rally ended in clashes near a main railway station. Police ran after people who had set rubbish bins on fire. The authorities said a dozen arrests were made.

Headline: Three killed in clashes between Bangladesh forces, protesters

At least three people have been shot dead on the third day of nationwide protests against what demonstrators are calling an anti-Islamic campaign led by a group of bloggers. On Sunday, Bangladesh police fired live rounds to break up crowds of angry protesters at Singair in the central district of Manikganj, AFP reported. As a minimum 18 bullet-hit victims were sent to the hospital following the clashes, reports said, adding that police officers were also among the injured. On Friday and Saturday, a total of six demonstrators were killed in similar clashes. Protesters demand the execution of bloggers they say have insulted Islam and Prophet Muhammad (PBUH). Islamic parties and the country's main opposition group, the Bangladesh Nationalist Party, have been holding rallies for the past three days.

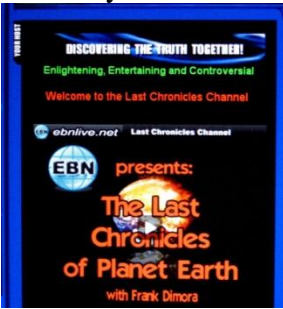

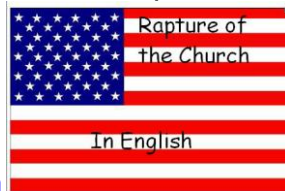
